Child Protection and Vulnerable Adults Policy

Introduction

Bruisyard village hall will be used by children, young people and vulnerable adults (collectively called 'vulnerable persons') and Bruisyard Parish Council and Bruisyard Parish Council Village Hall committee will take all reasonable steps to ensure their safety.

The Parish Council and Village Hall committee will ensure that the requirements of the Childrens Act 2004 and all related subsequent legislation are met in full.

Policy

A requirement placed on all users (clubs, associations etc) will be that they must have written agreement from the legal carer or guardian before having any direct contact with any vulnerable person. The Bruisyard Parish Council Village Hall committee will maintain a set of procedures and records in place at all times to safeguard vulnerable people, which will include procedures to check backgrounds and disclosures of all volunteers, trustees, employees or contractors who will supervise, care for or otherwise have significant direct contact with vulnerable people with the Criminal Records Bureau.

The Parish Council is responsible for the overall management and implementation of this policy.
